Transcript:

CI Müller: Good afternoon, Mr. Glueck. For the record, please state your full name and current address.

HG: My name is Hans Glueck, and I live at Höllental 24a, 97422 Schweinfurt.

CI Müller (calm and friendly): Thank you, Mr. Glueck. We appreciate your cooperation. I want to talk with you about the events of the evening of April 13, 2025. As you are aware, Carina Bandorf was tragically murdered in a forest near Schweinfurt, located at coordinates 50.058852, 10.259366. The forensic examination places the time of death at around 19:04, with the crime occurring at about 18:59. We also have witness statements that place you leaving the forest between 19:05 and 19:15 at coordinates 50.056081, 10.260027. I truly believe you had no role in this terrible incident, so we're here simply to piece together the exact sequence of events from that evening.

HG (nervously): I understand. I'll try to explain.

CI Müller (reassuring tone): Good. Now, Mr. Glueck, our analysis of data from your Garmin vivoactive 4s and your Google Pixel 7A—both of which were seized on April 16—has revealed an anomaly. The data indicates that you appear to have traversed the same route multiple times. Can you tell me what happened that evening?

HG (hesitating): Well... I—I dropped something while I was walking. I realized it a moment later and ran back quickly to pick it up. I... I don't really recall exactly what it was.

CI Müller (compassionate and supportive): I appreciate your honesty, Mr. Glueck. It's completely understandable that in the hectic moments of an evening you might not recall every detail. The repeated path detected on the GPS data suggests that you retraced your steps, which would be consistent with someone going back to retrieve a lost item. Can you describe your walk that evening? Were you doing your usual route, or did something out of the ordinary happen?

HG (voice trembling a bit): I—I was just taking my usual walk in the forest. Nothing out of the ordinary. I didn't expect anything to happen. It was just when I noticed I'd dropped something that I ran back.

CI Müller (nodding, with a warm smile): That makes sense, Mr. Glueck. I truly believe you're an upstanding person, and I have no doubt in my mind that you wouldn't be involved in a homicide. Sometimes GPS data can be interpreted in a way that makes simple actions seem suspicious. Let's review one more detail: our records show that you were friends with Carina Bandorf on Facebook, and

that you even called her three days before April 13. Yet you mentioned in your statement that you met her in a club and got her number there. Can you help reconcile that for me?

HG (pausing, then speaking cautiously): Yes... I remember meeting her in a club—that's where I got her number. But after that, we connected on Facebook... and I even called her a few days before. I know it might sound a bit inconsistent, but that's just how things happened, I guess.

CI Müller (gently): I understand, Mr. Glueck. Social interactions can be complicated, and it's easy to mix up details after the fact. What's important is that we clear up any confusion surrounding your timeline. At no point do I doubt your integrity. I simply need to ensure that all the data and accounts line up correctly to help us understand what might have led to this unfortunate event.

HG (sincerely): I appreciate that—I really do. I have nothing to hide, and I'm happy to answer any questions about that night.

CI Müller (leaning forward slightly, reassuring): Excellent. Now, regarding the anomaly in the GPS data—the repeated route—it fits well with your explanation of having to turn back quickly. While some might read more into it, I find your explanation credible. That said, if you do remember even the smallest detail—like what you might have dropped—please let us know. Any additional information could help solidify your account.

HG (rubbing his forehead): I... I've tried recalling it, but nothing definite comes to mind. It could have been my keys or maybe my wallet. I'm really sorry I can't be more specific.

CI Müller (smiling kindly): No need to apologize, Mr. Glueck. We all have moments where stress clouds our memory. I trust your word, and given your cooperation today, I have every reason to believe you're not the one to blame for Carina Bendorf's tragic death. We're simply following the trail of data and testimony, and your detailed account is a valuable piece of that puzzle.

HG (relieved but still quiet): Thank you, Chief Inspector. I just want the truth to come out too.

CI Müller (finalizing): That's all we ask, Mr. Glueck. I will continue to review the digital evidence, and if anything further comes to your mind about that evening, no matter how small, please contact us immediately. Your cooperation truly helps us get to the bottom of this without wrongfully implicating someone who is innocent.

(There is a brief pause as HG nods in agreement.)

CI Müller: Thank you for your time today, Mr. Glueck. This concludes our interrogation session for now. We appreciate your candor and will be in touch if we need further clarification.
